

ROGERS-BAGLEY-DANIELS-PEGUES HOUSE

RALEIGH, NC

The Rogers-Bagley-Daniels-Pegues House, circa 1855, is one of the best examples of Greek Revival architecture in Wake County. The structure is a National Historic Register property and is a contributing building to the East Raleigh / South Park National Register Historic District. Slated for demolition, the structure was completely upgraded to serve as corporate offices and meeting space. Improvements included all new building systems and meticulous restoration of significant architectural details such as the Italianate brackets and bas relief anthemion. Site improvements included restoration of field stone walls, landscaping, wrought iron fencing and accessibility upgrades.
