

UNC-GREENSBORO CHANCELLOR'S HOUSE

GREENSBORO, NC

Built in the 1920's, the UNC-Greensboro Chancellor's House is a Georgian Revival mansion designed by the architect Harry Barton. During its illustrious career, the residence served as the home of every university chancellor except one. Slated for demolition, the 420-ton brick structure was stabilized and relocated approximately nine hundred feet to a more prominent site. The six thousand square feet building was placed on a new foundation and completely renovated. The building received extensive cosmetic and structural upgrades. These included new electrical and mechanical systems and an elevator for accessibility. The facility has now been given new life and serves as the new Admissions and Visitor's Center for the University.
